Here at USA, I can be myself and talk about Jesus freely. The teachers are so kind, generous, and really look out for me. My friends are really supportive and help more than my old friends. I have felt more peace and happiness in my life, and I pray that it will continue with the friendships I have made. I love that USA is also a mission and service-minded school. I am planning on being a trauma surgeon and want to be the kind doctor that people can feel safe with.

My family is from Burundi, but I was born in Ethiopia in a refugee camp. Life was a struggle and parents longed to give me a better life. When I was three years old, we moved to America. Although NYC was a big improvement from the refugee camp, we still were not safe in the Bronx because there was a lot of crime. Thankfully, through God's providence, after several years we moved to Maine where there were more opportunities for our family. My parents raised me in a Christian home and wanted me to have an Adventist education, but we had financial challenges and transportation obstacles. When I was in middle school, my parents had a stronger desire to send me to an academy since I had the tendency to fall into the wrong crowds and my choices were not going in the right direction. My peers began to have a negative influence on me.

During the summer after I graduated 8th grade, my parents heard about Union Springs Academy from the Bible worker in my church. Upon meeting some of the staff, my interest was very high to attend. By the favor of the Lord, He worked out my finances with the collaboration of my home church, my parents' sacrifice and hard work, and generous sponsors whom I hope to meet in heaven.

The staff are a wonderful help by sharing their wisdom on life situations and answering questions I have about the Bible. I am very involved in campus life here at USA! I joined the ministry class, help as a church deacon, play on the basketball team, and sing in the touring choir. I am co-captain in the drum corps and an RA in the dorm. These roles have helped me to be a leader and a positive influence in my school. Most importantly, I see my relationship with God is growing stronger every day. I am currently studying for baptism and look forward to publicly giving my life fully to Christ where I intend to use my gifts and education to help serve God.
